

**Impartiality** – Assistance is provided solely based on need, without bias related to nationality, ethnicity, gender, religion, or political affiliation.

**Independence** – ODRH maintains full autonomy in its decision-making and program implementation, ensuring that humanitarian aid is not influenced by external political or economic pressures.

**Operational Effectiveness** – The organization commits to delivering timely, efficient, and high-quality humanitarian aid using best practices and evidence-based approaches.

**Accountability** - ODRH upholds transparency, monitoring, and reporting mechanisms to ensure responsible use of resources and responsiveness to beneficiaries' needs.

## VOCATIONAL TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING FOR WOMEN

ODRH has positively impacted the lives of over 200 women, girls, and youth, including individuals with disabilities and women who serve as the sole providers for their families. Through free vocational training in tailoring, sewing, Sormaduzi, Gulduzi, and knitting, as well as skill-sharing workshops, we have equipped them with essential skills to build sustainable livelihoods and achieve economic independence

The need for vocational training is growing rapidly, particularly in light of increasing restrictions on women's employment and education. To sustain and expand this vital initiative, we urgently seek the support of donors and partners. With collective effort, we can provide hope, opportunity, and dignity to women and youth in need, empowering them to build a better future.

## PROVIDING LIFE-SAVING HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE IN HERAT PROVINCE

ODRH has extended critical humanitarian aid to 1,000 vulnerable families in Herat province, supporting a total of 6,880 individuals, including 2,900 men, 3,980 women, and the households of 18 persons with disabilities. Through the generous financial and technical support of our donors and partners, we provided essential supplies such as warm food, drinking water, clothing, and blankets to those in urgent need.

This initiative was fully aligned with the FSAC cluster response packages, reinforcing ODRH's unwavering commitment to humanitarian assistance. In times of crisis, emergencies, and complex challenges, we stand in solidarity with the most vulnerable, ensuring they receive the care and support they desperately need. Our efforts reflect a dedication to alleviating suffering and fostering resilience within affected communities.







# ODRH'S PARTNERSHIP WITH UN WOMEN FOR GENDER EQUALITY AND EMPOWERMENT

ODRH is proud to be supported and funded by UN Women for an eight-month period, commencing on January 1, 2025, and concluding on August 31, 2025.
